

Iowa Games Pee Wee Veenker Memorial Golf Course July 16, 2020



In addition to the 2020 USGA RULES OF GOLF and the Iowa PGA Conditions of the Competition (reverse side); the following local rules will govern all play.

- FORMAT: Boys/Girls 8-13 will play 9-Holes Boys/Girls 7 & Under will play 6-Holes
- TEE MARKERS:Boys 10-13/Girls 12-13 will play the red teesAll other divisions modified in the fairway

Ball will be played Down. No rakes will be out, please play pick, clean and place within one club length no closer to the hole.

Players are not to touch or remove flagstick. Ball is considered holed if it is resting on an object (noodle) in place to prevent it from falling to the bottom of the cup even if the ball is not completely resting below the surface of the ground.

All no mow will be played as red penalty area for pee wees.

- 1. **SPORTSMANSHIP:** Any player using foul language, throwing clubs or demonstrating any other type of poor sportsmanship may be disqualified.
- CADDIES: Only one person may be designated as caddie. Caddie can carry clubs and any equipment. He/She can give advice and help keep score. Caddie's primary role is to help teach player their responsibilities as a player when they advance to the Junior Tour. No additional spectators are allowed for Pee Wees.
- 3. PACE OF PLAY: Pace of play is very important and will be enforced. Players should be ready to hit when it is there turn, limit practice swings, finish short putts, play ready golf when at all possible, place their bag on the side of the green that is closest to the next hole, etc. Please remember to abide by social distancing guidelines.
- 4. PLAYING 2 BALLS WHEN UNCERTAIN WHAT TO DO (RULE 20.1c(3)): Any player who is uncertain of his or her rights or procedure may complete the hole with two balls without penalty. The player should choose which ball will count if the Rules allow the procedure used for that ball, by announcing that choice to his or her marker before making another stroke. If player does not choose in time, the ball played first is treated as ball chosen by default. The player must report the facts of the situation to the committee before returning the scorecard, even if the player scores the same with both balls. The player is disqualified if he or she fails to do so.

PERSONAL MEASURING DEVICES: Players will be penalized if their use of a rangefinder is used for any reason other than distance. The first use of a banned rangefinder function will result in a two-stroke penalty, and any subsequent use during that round will result in the player's disqualification.

- 5. **TIES:** Ties will be decided by a scorecard playoff beginning on the #1 handicap hole.
- 6. SIGNING AND RETURNING CARD: After completion of your round please return your scorecard immediately to the scoring area. Please verbally check that hole by hole scores are correct with marker and tournament official. The score is official and cannot be changed once the competitor has dropped into the scorecard box.
- 7. SPECTATOR POLICY: All spectators must keep at least 30 yards away from players at all times. However, they may carry water and umbrellas as well as help look for lost balls. Spectators should try to keep even with or stay ahead of the groups as to not heed play of the group behind. Members are not permitted the use of caddies in Junior Tour events and may not take advice or help of any kind.
