GENERAL INFORMATION

<u>COVID 19 NOTICE: Note that we will be following the most recent CDC, Department of Health, Safe Sport and I'm On Ice Arena policies in place at the time of the event.</u>

COVID-19 INFORMATION:

As of March 15, 2022, and consistent with updated CDC guidance on mask use, face coverings are no longer required to be worn indoors at U.S. Figure Skating-sanctioned events or activity if your community levels are Low or Medium. We do encourage masks to be worn indoors if your community is in the High category based on the CDC Community Levels by County Map as announced on Feb. 25. Sanctioned activities include competitions (U.S. Figure Skating and Compete USA), exhibitions/performances and test sessions. For a complete list of archived COVID-19 resources, click here.

The 2024 Winter Iowa Games Figure Skating Competition is a merged U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned event endorsed by the ISI. For skaters in the ISI program, a conversion chart is provided to help determine your appropriate competition level.

This competition will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the <u>current rulebook</u>, as well as any pertinent updates which have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating website.

The 2024 Winter Iowa Games Figure Skating Competition is a qualifying competition for the 2024 National State Games of America Championships (SGA). Skaters may choose to enter each event at SGA that they qualify for by placing first, second or third at the State Games of Iowa competition.

All figure skaters residing in Iowa and neighboring states are invited to compete. Open to all skaters including United States Figure Skating (USFS) and Ice Skating Institute (ISI) members.

The Winter Iowa Games Figure Skating Competition is a U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned event endorsed by the ISI but membership in U.S. Figure Skating and/or ISI is NOT required.

ELIGIBILITY/TEST LEVEL

Test level: Competition level is the highest test passed as of the entry deadline in the discipline the skater is entering. Entrants may skate one level above that for which they qualify, but they may not skate down in any event.

Skaters may not register for an event level lower than allowed by their competitive floor. An athlete's competitive floor is set by one of the following scenarios:

- o If an athlete has a paid EMS series application for the NQS series, the event level registered for in the most recent NQS will become the lowest level they may compete at in any U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned event.
- o If an athlete has a paid EMS series application for the Excel Series, the event level registered for in the most recent Excel series will become the lowest level they may compete in any Excel event. For Well-Balanced and Specialty events the skater will be permitted to register at one level lower than the "floor" set by their excel series entry.
- o If an athlete has never had a paid EMS series application in the NQS or Excel series, the athlete may select their level based on their goals and technical skills as long as the minimum test requirements are met. (Note: if an athlete has passed the pre-preliminary singles test, they are no longer eligible for No Test or lower levels).

Skaters are not permitted to enter an Excel free skate and a Well-Balanced free skate event at the same competition (example: Juvenile Girls Free Skate and Juvenile Girls Excel Free Skate). However, they are

permitted to enter an Excel and a Well-Balanced event of different types such as a short program (if standalone event option), specialty or showcase events (example: Intermediate Women Short Program and Intermediate Women Excel Free Skate).

Age restrictions/requirements: Skaters entering Juvenile free skate events (Well Balanced Program) must be 12 years of age and younger for girls or 13 years of age and younger for boys at the close of entries. Skaters entering open juvenile free skate events (Well Balanced Program), must be at least 13 years of age for girls or 14 years of age for boys at the close of entries. Skaters entering Intermediate free skate events (Well Balanced Program) must be under 18 years of age. Skaters entering Adult free skate events (Well Balanced Program) must be 21 years of age or older.

Skaters entering beginner-pre-juvenile events will be divided as closely as possible by age should the number of entries warrant more than one group.

PARTNERED EVENTS:

Only one partner will complete registration for the team. During the registration process, you will be asked to identify your partner and verify their test information. The registered partner will be responsible for managing all aspects of the competition for the team including music/PPC upload, practice ice sales, etc.

Mandatory Athletes:

Athletes aged 18+ as of the competition start date who will be competing on a team (i.e. synchro, dance, pairs, shadow dance, theatre, etc.) with at least one minor athlete must complete SkateSafe training. *

Minor Athletes who turn 18 mid-season are encouraged to seek parental consent to take the online SafeSport training early to avoid any disruptions in their ability to participate as the training is required upon turning 18. The athlete will not be SafeSport compliant until they have completed the training and their Members Only portal reflects completion. LOCKER ROOMS AND CHANGING AREAS

Locker rooms and changing areas at U.S. Figure Skating competitive events are for athletes only, will be labeled with regard to specific use and where identified will be gender specific. Please review the Locker

Room and Changing Area Policy and the SafeSport Handbook (both found on the <u>U.S. Figure Skating</u> SafeSport page).

PRACTICE ICE

ImOn Ice will be offering practice sessions. All practice ice reservations and scheduling will be available through Entryeeze.

**Practice session times are subject to change if the competition needs to start earlier.

MUSIC

Music must be uploaded to Entryeeze only – no music will be played from CDs unless there is a technical issue. All music must be uploaded by February 19, 2024 – a \$20 late fee will be charged for each event for late music and will be payable at registration before the skater is allowed to compete. A duplicate of the music on CD should be readily available. If a CD is used during an event, music may be picked up at the registration table following each event. Every reasonable care will be taken, but the Cedar Rapids Ice Arena cannot be responsible for CDs left at the end of the competition.

PHOTOGRAPHY/VIDEOGRAPHY

Hand-held video equipment is only permitted in the bleacher area and should be used to record only your skater. Flash photography is NOT allowed during competition events or warm-ups.

AWARDS

Medals will be presented to the top three athletes in each division and will be presented at the conclusion of each level.

REGISTRATION

Registration will be open one to two hours before the first event and run through the last event of the day. The registration table will be located in the lobby of the Cedar Rapids Ice Arena. Please register promptly upon arrival.

OFFICIAL NOTICES

An official bulletin board will be maintained at the registration desk at the Cedar Rapids Ice Arena. It is the responsibility of each competitor, parent and coach to check the bulletin board frequently for any schedule changes and/or additional information. Skaters are requested to arrive 60 minutes prior to the scheduled time of their event. A tentative schedule of events will be posted prior to the competition.

LIABILITY

U.S. Figure Skating and the Cedar Rapids Ice Arena accept no responsibility for injury or damage sustained by any participant in this competition. This is in accordance with Rule 1600 of the official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook.

JUDGING SYSTEM

The 6.0 Majority Judging System will be used for all events.

INFORMATION REGARDING COACHES

To be a credentialed coach at a sanctioned nonqualifying competition, coaches must meet the compliance requirements listed below and verified by the U.S. Figure Skating.

Coach/Choreographer (domestic/non-foreign):

- ✓ Must be a current full member of U.S. Figure Skating either through a member club or as an individual member.
- ✓ If 18 years or older, must submit information for, proper payment of \$30 and successfully pass a background check.*
 - o The background check will be valid for two seasons, the one in which it was completed plus one additional.
- ✓ If 18 years or older, must complete annual SafeSport Training. *
 - o The training will be valid for 365 days from date of completion and there is no cost for the training/certification.
- ✓ Must complete the Professional Coach/Choreographer Coaching Education Requirement (CER) through the <u>Professional Skaters Association (PSA)</u>.
- ✓ Must submit proof of general liability insurance with limits of \$1 million per occurrence/ \$5 million aggregate.
- ✓ Must agree to the U.S. Figure Skating Code of Ethics. *
- ✓ Must complete three waivers: 1) Assumption of Risk, Waiver and Release and Indemnification Agreement,
 2) Medical Consent and 3) Name and Likeness Release and Consent Agreement. *
- ✓ If attending a qualifying competition or traveling as a part of Team USA and/or International Selection Pool (ISP), must be a full member of the <u>Professional Skaters Association (PSA)</u>.

Learn to Skate USA Coach:

- ✓ Must be a current full member of U.S. Figure Skating either through a member club or as an individual member OR Learn to Skate USA instructor membership
- ✓ If 18 years or older, must submit information for, proper payment of \$30 and successfully pass a background check.*
 - o The background check will be valid for two seasons, the one in which it was completed plus one additional.
- ✓ If 18 years or older, must complete annual SafeSport Training. *
 - o The training will be valid for 365 days from date of completion and there is no cost for the training/certification.
- ✓ Learn to Skate USA Instructor Certification completed OR U.S. Figure Skating compliance coach (details above)

Foreign Coach/Choreographer:

✓ Required to present the LOC with a letter from their federation verifying they are a member in good standing.

REFUNDS

- Entries received after the maximum number has been accepted.
- Entries received in a division that is cancelled due to minimal entries.
- Entries of non-qualified participants.
- Entries received after the deadline. In this case, there will be a \$5.00 processing fee assessed to all refunds.

NO REFUND WILL BE PERMITTED BECAUSE AN ENTRANT FAILS TO PARTICIPATE OR IS REMOVED FROM COMPETITION.

NO REFUND WILL BE PERMITTED ONCE COMPETITION SCHEDULES HAVE BEEN SET OR RECEIVED FROM THE REFEREE.
